

North-East Romania



Part of the historical province of Moldavia, the Northeastern Region of Romania is an area where history, culture, and tradition complement the natural environment, particularly attractive. The North-East Region is the largest development region of Romania in terms of the number of inhabitants and the area covered, being composed of six counties: Bacău, Botoșani, Iași, Neamț, Suceava, and Vâlcea.

Relief

The region is divided into 3 zones:

- the Carpathian mountains - 28%;
- the Subcarpathian area - 12%;
- the eastern plateau area - 60%;

Hydrographic network:

The region is crossed by two major rivers:

- Siret (42,800 km²);
- Prut (32,800 km²);

Climate Average:

- annual temperatures 8-10° C;
